Governor Ron DeSantis' and First Lady Casey DeSantis' Native American Heritage Month Art Contest

Governor Ron DeSantis' and First Lady Casey DeSantis' Native American Heritage Month Art Contest is open to all K-3 students in Florida.

Eligibility: Each contestant must be a legal resident of Florida and attend any Florida school in grades K-3 (including public, charter, private, home or virtual) at the time of his/her entry.

Entry Dates: Entries must be mailed to Volunteer Florida, Native American Heritage Month Committee, 1545 Raymond Diehl Road, Suite 250, Tallahassee, Florida 32308. All entries must be <u>received</u> no later than 5:00 p.m. Eastern Time on Thursday, November 9, 2023. Emailed or faxed entries will not be accepted. Contestants are responsible for all shipping costs.

Entry Form: Student must provide all required information requested on the entry form and entry form must be legible. The student and parent/legal guardian are required to read and understand these rules in order to submit the entry form in its entirety. The entry form includes a release and certification that must be signed by a parent or guardian.

Create an art piece inspired by this year's theme,

"Highlighting Native American Heroes and their Accomplishments"

Artwork: Student must submit original, two-dimensional artwork.

- 1. Student artwork must be original, created by only the student. Artwork may not be drawn from any existing artwork (photograph, advertisement, etc.) not created by the student.
- 2. Student artwork must measure 8½" by 11" and be created using any two-dimensional medium including:
 - a) drawing (pencil, ink, crayon, graphite, etc.)
 - b) painting (pastel, watercolor, spray paint, oils, etc.) Each student may enter only one submission to this contest.

Labeling Requirements: Each submission must have the entry form attached. A copy of the completed entry form must also be attached to the back of the artwork.

Transfer of Rights: Each applicant and his/her parent or guardian must agree to give all rights to the submitted artwork, including copyright, to the Executive Office of the Governor. This transfer of rights will allow the Executive Office of the Governor, at a minimum, to reproduce, distribute, and display your artwork. The winner's submission will be duplicated in various mediums and used to promote Native American Heritage Month throughout the state. This means that when you submit your artwork to participate in this contest, your artwork will become the property of the Executive Office of the Governor and will not be returned.

Public Disclosure: The Florida Public Records Act, located in Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, generally requires that all activities, including this contest, are open to the public. Therefore, all aspects of your involvement in this contest, including your artwork, will be subject to public disclosure.

Once the winners are announced, the decision is final.
